Sister2Sister Programs

The Children's Feeding Program

Currently, Sister2Sister feeds lunch to almost 100 orphaned children daily. Many more are in need and are awaiting help.

Orphan Education

Sister2Sister provides funds to send orphans to get a high school education.



The Children's Home

Sister2Sister is building the S2S Children's Home and School for orphaned children in Ngong, Kenya.



Programs for Women

Sister2Sister provides programs and assistance for women in many difficult situations in Kenya and locally, including:

- mothers of special needs children
- young women and girls in need of health education, awareness and supplies
- divorced or widowed women facing raising a family alone
- women in need of confidence and self esteem

Kenya Prayer Centers

Currently, Sister2Sister sponsors fifteen nondenominational prayer centers in Kenya where women meet to pray for their needs and for the nation. They share their problems and form bonds of friendship.

- Jewelry making
- Basket weaving
- Feeding programs for under privileged children
- Entrepreneurial skills

About Founder Purity Ruchugo

At age four, Kenyan-born Purity Ruchugo lost her father from health complications suffered during his political detention in a concentration camp. Only prayer, however, kept her father alive for seven years of incarceration, and Purity bases her faith – and her 'miracle birth' – on prayer. Growing up, she admired many women role models, and after her family emigrated to the U.S. in the 1980s, she began an international ministry based on those examples.
